### **REGULATORY OVERVIEW**



- ICS stands for 'Import Control System'. This is the electronic security screening system for goods destined to, or in transit through, the European Union (EU\*), Switzerland & Norway.

- Additionally, the EU authorities are tightening and reviewing the procedures linked to the entry process, namely
  presentation, temporary storage (PN/TS) and new requirement for transit road movements (NCTS-5).

Release	Go-Live	Scope
ICS2 - Release 1&2	Already live	Security screening of all air shipments <u>prior to loading</u> at the country of departure, and <u>pre-arrival</u> into (or transiting via) the European Union, CH and NO.
ICS2 - Release 3	by Sept 2025	Security screening of all road shipments <b><u>pre-arrival</u></b> into (or transiting via) the European Union, CH and NO.
PN/TS	2023-2025	Varying go-live dates depending on country. PN/TS scope excludes the CH, NO and the UK.
NCTS-5	2023-2025	Varying go-live dates depending on country. NCTS-5 scope includes CH, NO and UK.

#### IMPACT: •

The most significant change applicable is the introduction of new electronic messages in a granular level.



- EU Authorities require a detailed goods description per commodity (on line item level), the respective
   Harmonized System (HS) code and consignee EORI where applicable. Additionally for road movements the EU
   Authorities must be able to derive the 6 digit HS code from the goods description.
- Therefore, DHL Aviation relies on high quality electronic data from the Customer to be able to meet the legal requirements and timelines.

#### **HOW CAN SHIPPERS/FORWARDERS AVOID DELAYS AND PENALTIES?**

In order to avoid delays and penalties, it is important that shippers/forwarders **provide complete**, **detailed and accurate data electronically** via our service provider DESCARTES **prior to tender**.

Among others, the two most critical data elements to ensure a smooth process at the appropriate customs formalities are:

## 1 Compliant Goods Descriptions per line item

Provide accurate and specific commodities description, using **detailed**, **precise & plain language**, with sufficient details about the nature of goods. To comply with EU regulations for road, the goods description must be detailed enough to allow the determination of the 6 digit Harmonized System (HS) code

- The detailed description per commodity must indicate what the goods are, for which purpose the goods are used and what they are made of – for example: "Wooden dining table", "Car brake pads"
- Don't use generic goods descriptions such as "gifts", "samples", "spare parts", "equipment", "clothes", "textiles", etc.

2 Harmonized System (HS) code

Provide the **respective Harmonized System (HS) Code (6 digits) on line item** for each of the different commodities.

- Preferably, indicate the complete Tariff
   Code of each commodity being shipped.
- The Harmonized System (HS) Code is defined by the World Customs
   Organization (WCO), and the 2022 HS
   Nomenclature edition is publicly available on the WCO website for the first 6 digits.
